# **REMINDER OF IMMUNIZATION LAWS**

It is a state law that we have a record of immunizations before your child can start kindergarten. Please send this information with your child the first day of school if we do not already have it. All students in kindergarten through twelfth grade must have evidence of receiving two doses of MMR vaccine. All students in kindergarten through seventh grade are required to have three doses of hepatitis B vaccine. If parents have a good cause/religious objection, a letter, signed by the parent, stating the objection must be on file in the school immunization records. Delaware County Health Department gives immunizations at a reduced price. You can call them for times and dates, (740) 368-1700.

# ITEMS OF INTEREST FOR ELEMENTARY:

### STUDENT PICKUP AND DROP OFF

Pick up will be east of the gym door on the south side of the south parking lot. Drop off will be at the Connector. The east gym doors will **not** be open in the morning. The front doors of the church will not be open at any time. Do not block the driveway. If you must leave your car or wait any length of time, please pull into a parking space in either the east or student lot to help traffic flow.

## ELEMENTARY STUDENT DRESS CODE REMINDERS

Parents please read and encourage students to adhere to the rules.

- \*\*Shoes: Tennis shoes are preferred for the playground. Due to injuries in the classroom and on the playground, flip flops should not be worn to school. If sandals are worn, they should be substantial and cover much of the feet.
- \*\*Shirts under uniform tops should be white only and free of visible slogans or logos.
- \*\*Belts are required to be worn with shorts and pants.
- \*\*Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- \*\*Socks should be plain white, navy, red, or khaki. No stripes or wild patterns are permitted.
- \*\*Hair must be in compliance the first day of school. Boy's hair must be neatly trimmed above the collar and eyebrows. Half the ear must show. Hair dyeing (unnatural colors) or styles that draw undue attention are not permitted for girls or boys.

Students with names beginning with P-Z will report to school on Wednesday, August 20 and stay home on Tuesday, August 19. All kindergarten students will report to school on Thursday, August 21.
