CONGRATUALTIONS FALL TEAMS

Congratulations to all of our fall sport's participants. The middle school soccer team finished 8-7, while middle school volleyball went 15-5 taking 2nd place in the COAL tournament. Zane Fisher completed his first year of cross country placing 5th at the COAL meet. Zach Fisher and Dakota Howard, our only high school cross country runners, ended their seasons with PR's of 18:32 and 21:58 respectively. Zach took 1st place out of 199 runners at the Mt. Vernon Invitational! The high school soccer team's record was 10-6-3 after beating MOCAL Champion Madison Christian in round 2 of Districts in a dramatic PK shootout. The boys finished a great season losing to formidable Worthington Christian in the District Semi-Finals. Our girls' volleyball team closed out a strong season (21-3) as District Runners-Up, losing only to Berne Union, who they later beat in District Semi-Finals, and District Champion Fairfield Christian.
